
Our Values

- Habitat Choptank offers affordable homeownership opportunities to qualifying families who meet income guidelines that are updated annually to reflect official numbers from Housing and Urban Development.
- Habitat Choptank follows equal housing opportunity laws and builds houses in partnership with those in need regardless of race, religion or any other characteristic.
- Local Habitat for Humanity affiliates are independent, nonprofit organizations that operate in a specific service area within the framework of the Habitat Affiliate Covenant.



Our Record



Habitat Choptank strives to not only build homes but also to collaborate with all people interested in the quality of life in the region through the creation of affordable housing opportunities.

In Talbot and Dorchester counties, Habitat Choptank works in partnership with many low to moderate income working families who are unable to buy a house with conventional mortgage financing.

We have an impressive track record:

- 107 homes in Dorchester and Talbot Counties
- 2% foreclosure rate
- Over 260 critical home repairs

Volunteering with Habitat

Habitat for Humanity Choptank is a volunteerdriven organization and relies on volunteers to operate.

From working on construction and repair sites, in the office, at the ReStore, or serving on committees, our volunteers greatly impact every aspect of our organization.

Please note that certain volunteer positions require a criminal background check and all volunteer positions require a review against the sexual offender registry (our Volunteer Handbook provides more detail).

Whatever your skill or interest, there is a place for you in our volunteer program.

Volunteer Orientation

- Must complete volunteer orientation, as well as an application and annual waiver.
- Provide and keep current personal contact information and emergency contacts.
- Read and agree to the following Habitat Choptank policies as outlined in the Volunteer Handbook:
 - Code of Conduct
 - Discrimination and Harassment
 - Conflict Resolution
 - Personal Health and Drug and Alcohol Abuse
 - Sexual Offender and Criminal Background Check
 - Media Release



Volunteer Requirements



- Age requirements:
 - Youths age 15 and younger are prohibited from active construction sites due to liability concerns.
 - Youths age 16-17 may perform general construction work, but may not use power tools, motor vehicles, participate in excavation, roofing, or work from a height of six feet or more.
 - Adults age 18 and older may participate in all tasks available.
- Proper attire is required for construction, home repair, and ReStore sites - closed-toed, solid-soled shoes; comfortable, breathable clothing that can get dirty.

Volunteer Requirements (cont.)

- Schedule yourself for shifts using our online registration system (link will be provided by the Volunteer Coordinator).
- Sign in and out at the volunteer site with our online registration.
- Provide your own transportation.
- Be punctual when volunteering and at least ten minutes early when on a construction site.
- Additional hands-on training will be provided at each location, as necessary.
